I, William Smith of the City of Edmonton, in the Province  
of Alberta, Laborer, make oath and say:

1. On the 16th day of May last past I went to the premises  
of the defendant company and endeavored to purchase a dozen  
bottles of "Capitol" beer, and was told by the person in charge  
to whom I applied that the company could not furnish the said  
beer except by wholesale and that I would have to get the beer  
from a liquor store.
2. On the same day I went into the Edmonton Hotel in Edmonton  
and asked for a bottle of Budweiser beer and in answer to my  
request therefor I was sold the bottle of beer which is now  
shown to me and marked exhibit "A" to this my affidavit.
3. On the afternoon of the same day I visited the Imperial  
Hotel in Edmonton and asked for Budweiser beer and in answer to  
my application therefor I was sold the bottle of beer which is  
now shown to me and marked exhibit "B" to this my affidavit.

4. On the afternoon of the 17th day of May last I went into the Richelieu Hotel in Edmonton and asked for Budweiser beer and I was sold the bottle of beer which is now shown to me and marked exhibit "C" to this my affidavit.

5. On the same afternoon I visited Wilson's Limited liquor store in Edmonton and asked for Budweiser beer. I was sold the two quart bottles of beer which are now shown to me and marked exhibits "D" and "E" respectively to this my affidavit.

6. On the same afternoon I visited the Victoria Hotel in Edmonton and asked for Budweiser beer and in answer to my request I was sold the bottle of beer now shown to me and marked exhibit "F" to this my affidavit.

7. Except in the case of Wilson Brothers, which is a wholesale establishment, I merely entered the bar of the hotel and asked for Budweiser beer and the person in charge of the bar handed me the bottles respectively marked as exhibits to my affidavit and I paid him the price that he asked me for the same. In the case of Wilson Limited I entered the store and asked for a couple of bottles of Budweiser beer and was sold the two bottles of beer I have marked as exhibits by the person in charge of the store and paid him for the same; taking the bottles in all cases away with me and marking them for identification.
