BE IT REMEMBERED that Thomas Purcell being a prisoner at Lethbridge in the said Judicial District, committed for trial on a charge "for that he the said Thomas Purcell [of} Pot Hole in the said Territories on or about the 3rd day of Decem[ber] A.D. 1893 murdered one David Akers," and having [been] brought before me the undersigned one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of the Northwest Territories aforesaid, at Lethbridge aforesaid on the fifteenth day of January in the year Eighteen hundred and ninety-four and being arraigned upon the said charge, he the said Thomas Purcell pleaded not guilty;

And upon the fourteenth day of February in the year aforesaid a jury consisting of William Stafford, Junior, L.N. McEwen, Duncan Duff, William Henderson, E.J. Hodder and William Oliver, being duly empanelled and sworn and he the said Thomas Purcell declaring himself ready for trial;
