

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF ALBERTA: EDMONTON JUDICIAL DISTRICT.

TO THE SUPREME COURT OF ALBERTA:

THE PETITION OF WILLIAM BOARD of the City of
Edmonton in the Province of Alberta,

SEMBLY SHEWETH:

1. That your Petitioner was married in the month of February, in the year 1908, in the City of Edmonton, to Mary Board, then Mary Mahonik,
2. That after his said marriage your petitioner lived and cohabited with his said wife at divers places and at the Village of Vegreville in the Province of Alberta, and that your petitioner and his said wife have had issue of their said marriage three children, namely, Nick, born on the 8th of March, 1908, Katrine born on the 6th of April, 1908, and Roy born on the 2nd of April, 1910.
3. That on or about the 8th of April in the year 1915 the said Mary board deserted your petitioner and cohabited with one John Kepaniuk, and that on the 5th day of April, and other days between that day and the month of October of the year 1915, the said Mary Board committed adultery with the said John Kepaniuk.
4. That sometime during the month of October or November of the

year, 1915 the said Mary Board resided and cohabited with one Mike Kutechis at the Village of Vegreville and lived with him until about the 15th day of April, 1917, at the Village of Vegreville as man and wife, during which period, upon divers occasions, she committed adultery with the said Mike Kutechis.

5. That on or about the 15th of April, A.D., 1917, the said Mary Board went to live with William Kuzek at the Village of Vegreville as husband and wife, and is now and ever since the said 15th day of April, 1917, has been cohabiting with and upon divers occasions during the said period has committed adultery with the said William Kuzek at the Village of Vegreville in the Province of Alberta.

6. That since the 15th day of April, 1917, on divers occasions since that time the said William Kuzek has committed adultery with the said Mary Board.

7. That no previous proceedings with reference to the said marriage have either been commenced or prosecuted in the Supreme Court of Alberta, by or on behalf of either of the parties to the same.

8. That at the time of the said marriage both the parties thereto were domiciled in the Province of Alberta, in the Dominion of Canada.

Your petitioner therefore humbly prays that your Lordship will be pleased to decree that your petitioner's said marriage may be dissolved and that he may have the custody of his said children; together with such further and other relief in the premises as to your Lordship may seem meet.
